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## ADEWALE ROLAND TUNDE SOLARIN

### 1 INTRODUCTION

**ADEWALE SOLARIN**, FMAN, FPNGMS, FNMS, a Professor of Mathematics was the Director/Chief Executive Officer, National Mathematical Centre (NMC), Abuja, from 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 to 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2016. He was the President of African Mathematical Union (AMU) in July, 2013 to July, 2017. Currently the President, African Mathematical Union Pan African Mathematical Olympiads Commirion. He was appointed COMSATS Distinguished Professor of Mathematics in 2014. He was appointed a member of the Scientific Board of UNESCO's International Basic Science Programme, Paris, France on 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2015 and UNESCO Chair of Mathematics the same year. Before his appointment as CEO, he was the Dean, School of Mathematical Studies; Coordinator, Tertiary Institutions Students Mathematics Competitions; Principal Trainer, Nigerian Team for International Mathematics Olympiads; Coordinator, Mental Mathematics for Basic Education Programme; all at the National Mathematical Centre, Abuja, Nigeria. At the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Nigeria, he was Deputy Vice – Chancellor (Dec. 2004 to Dec. 2006), a member of the Governing Council of (2000-2006); Director, Academic Planning, (2000-2004); Head, Department of Mathematical Sciences, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Ogun State, Nigeria ( 1997-2000 ). He was the brain behind the creation of the Centre for Human Resources Development (CENHURD), which became the highest IGR point in the University.

Adewale, with background in Statistics and a Ph. D. in Mathematics, has for 43 years taught various undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Science, in the university system in Nigeria and outside the country.

He was one of the prime movers of the inauguration of the Quality Control Society of Nigeria (QCSON) in 1990. Consequently, he became the foundation National President of the Society in 1990, a position he held till December 1994.



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## 2 TRAINING AND CONSULTING EXPERIENCE

Adewale, a Quality and Productivity Improvement Consultant, had his first encounter with Quality Control in 1978 and Total Quality Management (TQM) in 1989.

Since then, he has participated in national and international conferences, seminars and workshops on Quality Control, Total Quality Management, Productivity Improvement and related topics. These were organised Standards Organisation of Nigeria (SON); National Productivity Centre (NPC); Federal Ministry of Commerce and Tourism and Nigerian Export Promotion Council (NEPC) to mention but a few. His participation was in various capacities, including Facilitator, Guest Speaker, Coordinator and Convener.

Since 1991, he has been the Principal Consultant in TQM Implementations in many companies in Nigeria, including UACN Plc, which was ranked the biggest private conglomerate in Africa in the 1990s.

He has been Principal Facilitator to foremost consulting outfits on TQM in Nigeria to design and run workshops on topics including TQM for Managers; Training-The-Trainers in TQM; Building World-Class Customer-Oriented Culture in the Banking Industry to mention but a few.

Adewale was the Team Leader of the Inter-university Research Team on Quality Management (IRTQM). IRTQM was a university-based Team, involved in conducting research into TQM Implementation and Development in Nigeria. IRTQM was responsible for organising annual national and international conferences on TQM in Nigeria. These activities were carried out with support from many organisations in the private sector, including Chevron Nigeria Ltd; The Document Company - H. S. Xerox; Shell Development Company; and a host of others.

He played leading role in the design and execution of cutting-edge training-related activities for blue chip companies in Nigeria including: Bordpak Premier Packaging (BPP), Apapa ( A division of UACN Plc) (1992-1996); Eagle Package Printing, Otta (1993-1995); Lion of Africa Insurance PLC; First Bank PLC (1994-1995); Vita Foam Nig. PLC (1999-2000) and Flour Mills Nig. PLC (2012).

## 3 COORDINATION OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES AND WORKSHOPS

Adewale coordinated CTA Central and West Africa Anglophone Regional Training Course on Scientific Data Management for five years (2001-2006); He has organized the AMU – ICMS and Young African Mathematicians Medal Awards twice (UNAAB



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2003, NMC 2009). He has also organized workshops numerous research workshops at NMC including, 2009 NMC-ANGAAD Workshop on Algebra Applied to Development; and 2010 London Mathematical Society-National Mathematical Centre Lectures on Banach Algebra.

#### **4 CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION**

Adewale's first experience with curriculum development and implementation dated back to 1982, when he designed the B. Sc. Statistics programme of the Department of Mathematical Sciences, Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-Iwoye, Ogun State. Since then, he has coordinated the design of other thirteen curricula up to Ph.D. level.

#### **5 DEVELOPMENT OF ACADEMIC DEPARTMENT/UNIT**

Adewale assumed leadership of the Department of Mathematical Science, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, in September 1997, with 10 academic staff including 2 Ph.D.s, majority were Assistant Lecturers. He developed appropriate postgraduate programmes to train the staff members. The Department grew to up to 30 academic staff, including 2 professors, 3 of the initial staff who were Assistant Lecturers have risen to the professorial cadre and one is a full professor. The Department was split into three Departments in 2004, and the three still received full accreditation in the 2005 NUC accreditation exercises.

Adewale was appointed Director of the Academic Planning Unit, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, in March 2000. He was able to strategically place the Unit as the hub of academic activities in the University and the originator of most academic innovations in the system. The innovations made by the Unit included the transformation of the lecture rooms from the use of chalk and blackboards to markers and whiteboards and a study which drastically reduced examination materials consumption by more than 50%, saving the University millions of naira per semester.

He assumed office as Deputy Vice-Chancellor in December, 2004; apart from ensuring that all relevant committees meet regularly, he also introduced the quarterly meeting of Deans and their Heads of departments with the Deputy Vice-Chancellor. This meeting created avenue for interactions between Management and the academic departments. At this forum, issues were discussed before they degenerated into serious problems. He



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made the office more accessible to staff making communication between staff and Management smoother, thereby reducing tension in the system.

### **School of Mathematical Studies (SMS), National Mathematical Centre, Abuja**

He assumed office as the Dean in August, 2008. He introduced National Mathematics Competitions for tertiary institutions. The annual National Mathematics Competition for Undergraduate Student (NAMCUS) has had fourth edition in 2012, while the annual National Mathematics Competitions for Polytechnics and Colleges of Education (NAMCPS/NAMCCES) has had second edition in 2012; they are a major part of the activities for **2012 Nigerian Year of Mathematics celebration**.

He introduced training strategies that led the Nigerian IMO team winning their first medal in 2010. This has also led to the establishment of the **NMC International Science Academy** to provide a critical mass for the Nigerian Olympiad Teams. SMS has been spearheading the Mental Arithmetic Programme.

### **6 COMPUTER SCIENCE EXPERIENCE**

Adewale was one of the first few Nigerians to offer a course in Computer programming in 1972 at the former University of Ife, Ile-Ife, Nigeria. He developed the knowledge of programming to the point of being able to use FORTRAN for algebraic programming in his Ph. D. thesis.

He has worked with GAP, UNIX, MS-DOS, Windows, FORTRAN, BASIC languages, Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel, Microsoft Powerpoint, SPSS, INTERNET etc. He has successfully supervised or co-supervised many M.Sc. and Ph.D. theses in Computer Science.

### **7 RESEARCH AND PUBLICATIONS**

Adewale wrote an M. Sc. thesis in Statistics and a Ph. D. thesis in Mathematics.

He has supervised student theses (B. Sc., M. Sc., Ph. D., PGD, MBA, and MBF) in topics in Mathematics, Statistics, Quality Control, Computer Science, and Business Management in Nigeria and abroad.

He has published more than 40 papers in statistics and mathematics in internationally reputable journals. He has written more than 20 papers on Total Quality Management and related topics for journals, seminars, workshops and conferences.



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**He has supervised or co-supervised more than 50 postgraduate theses, including 12 PhDs, eight (8) of them have attained professorial cadre, with six (6) full professors.**

### **8 EXTERNAL EXAMINATION SERVICES**

Adewale has served as external examiner to Universities in Nigeria and abroad for undergraduate and postgraduate programme including examination of Ph.D. theses. He was an external examiner in the Department of Mathematics, University of Dar-Es-Salaam, Dar-Es-Salaam, Tanzania (2004-2006) and Department of Mathematics, Makerere University, Kampala, Uganda (2006-2008). Department of Mathematics, University For Development Studies, Navrongo, Ghana (2011).

He has served as chairman of many Science accreditation teams of the National Universities Commission for academic programmes. He has also served as chairman of NUC team for institutional accreditation of Universities.

### **10 AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS**

Adewale had his undergraduate studies with Federal Government Scholarship. His M. Sc. and Ph. D. degrees were undertaken with the University of Ife scholarship. He bagged the first Ph. D. (Mathematics) awarded by Obafemi Awolowo University, Nigeria.

He has enjoyed a number of international scholarships and fellowships including:

International mathematical Union (IMU) - ICM-90 Scholar, Kyoto, Japan.

In 1993, Adewale received a letter of commendation from the Head of State of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, for drawing a programme for achieving National Excellence using TQM principles and philosophy.



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In 1999, he delivered the 9<sup>th</sup> University of Agriculture Abeokuta Inaugural Lecture titled: **TOTAL QUALITY – A MATHEMATICAL PANACEA FOR NATIONAL PRODUCTIVITY IMPROVEMENT.**

In 2013, he was inducted as Fellow of Mathematical Association of Nigeria (FMAN), also appointed as COMSATS Distinguished Professor of Mathematics.

In 2015, he was appointed a member of the Board of UNSECO-International Basic Science Programme (IBSP), Paris-France; also UNESCO-NMC Chair of Mathematics.

In 2016, he was inducted as a Fellow of the Nigerian Mathematical Society (FNMS).

#### **5.1.1 CONTRIBUTION TO DEVELOPMENT OF ACADEMIC DEPARTMENT/UNITS**

I assumed leadership of the Department of Mathematical Science, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, in September 1997, with 10 academic staff including 2 Ph.D.s, majority were Assistant Lecturers. I developed appropriate postgraduate programmes to train the staff members. The Department grew up to 30 academic staff, including 2 professors, 3 of the initial staff who were Assistant Lecturers have risen to the professorial cadre and one is a full professor. The Department was split into three Departments in 2004, and the three still received full accreditation in the 2005 NUC accreditation exercises.



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I assumed office as Deputy Vice-Chancellor in December, 2004; apart from ensuring that all relevant committees meet regularly, I also introduced the quarterly meeting of Deans and their Heads of departments with the Deputy Vice-Chancellor. This meeting created avenue for interactions between Management and the academic departments. At this forum, issues were discussed before they degenerated into serious problems. I made the office more accessible to staff making communication between staff and Management smoother, thereby reducing tension in the system.

### **School of Mathematical Studies (SMS), National Mathematical Centre, Abuja**

I assumed office as the Dean in August, 2008. I introduced National Mathematics Competitions for tertiary institutions. The annual National Mathematics Competition for Undergraduate Student (NAMCUS) has had fourth edition in 2012, while the annual National Mathematics Competitions for Polytechnics and Colleges of Education (NAMCPS/NAMCCES) has had second edition in 2012; they are a major part of the activities for **2012 Nigerian Year of Mathematics celebration**.

I introduced training strategies that led the Nigerian IMO team winning their first medal in 2010. This has also led to the establishment of the **NMC International Science Academy** to provide a critical mass for the Nigerian Olympiad Teams.
